A SURVEY OF REGISTERED NEW HAMPSHIRE VOTERS

Conducted March 23-24, 2022

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SURVEY NOTES

These results are from the Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 1265 New Hampshire registered voters. Surveys were collected between March 23rd and 24th, 2022, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the name identification, job approval, and the Senate ballot test series. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 2.8% with a confidence interval of 95%; the margin of sampling error for questions specific to congressional districts are 3.8% for the 1st Congressional District and 4.0% for the 2nd Congressional District. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, "Voters have become somewhat more optimistic since our last poll in January, which has led to improved job approval for all incumbents. Potential challengers are relatively unknown, but most of the top races are still likely to become competitive as voters pay increasing attention. As always, campaigns and candidate quality matter."

The political environment has improved for incumbent officeholders. 68% of New Hampshire registered voters now believe the country is on the wrong track, down from 74% in January. 21% believe it is headed in the right direction.

Incumbent job approval has rebounded somewhat. President Joe Biden has increased his job approval to 43%-57% from 41%-58% in January. Governor Chris Sununu has recovered from his career low and is now at 62%-36%. Senator Jeanne Shaheen has improved slightly and is now at 48%-47%; Senator Maggie Hassan is at 46%-49%; Congressman Chris Pappas is at 43%-42%; and Congresswoman Annie Kuster is at 42%-45%.

Approval of President Biden's handling of the economy remains unchanged. 58% of voters disapprove of the job Biden has done on the economy against 40% who approve, unchanged since January. A plurality of 32% blame high inflation on Biden.

Neither Biden nor Vice President Kamala Harris are guaranteed majority support from voters who identify as Democrats in the 2024 New Hampshire Primary. 49% would likely support Biden, while 30% would support a new candidate. If Biden declined to stand for re-election, 42% would likely support Harris, while 36% would support a new candidate.

The Republican lead on the generic ballot has narrowed. Republicans now hold a 4-point lead at 46%-42%, down from a 6-point advantage.

Governor Sununu starts with a strong lead in his re-election campaign. Sununu is the only incumbent that enjoys ballot strength over 50%, and leads in a hypothetical matchup against his only announced challenger, State Senator Tom Sherman, 51%-24%.

Voters have yet to focus on potential challengers to Senator Hassan. 2020 primary candidate Don Bolduc continues to be the best known of the field with 70% name recognition (74% among registered Republicans) and 26%-20% favorability (51%-9% GOP); Trailing Bolduc in name recognition are New Hampshire Senate President Chuck Morse with 57% (69% GOP) and 17%-13% favorability (31%-6% GOP); and Londonderry Town Manager Kevin Smith with 47% (61% GOP) and 13%-10% favorability (28%-5% GOP).

Hypothetical Senate match-up have become more polarized as Republican voters start lining up behind challengers to Hassan. Hassan's ballot strength in hypothetical match-ups averages 44%, up 2 points from January, but her potential opponents' ballot strength averages 36%, up 7 points from January. As the best-known, Bolduc holds Hassan to the tightest margin at 5 points, 44%-39%.

Supreme Court nominee Ketanji Brown Jackson is a plus for Hassan. 53% support Jackson's confirmation, versus 36% who oppose.


President Biden is a negative for Hassan and the House delegation. 53% prefer a federal candidate that would serve as a check on Biden's power, versus 41% who prefer one that would help him enact his agenda. 59% support restarting construction of the Keystone XL pipeline cancelled by Biden.


Voter priorities for the federal budget favor challengers. Reducing the deficit is the top priority of 28% of voters, followed by cutting taxes at 25%. Climate change mitigation is the top priority of 22%; followed by increased social spending at 14%; and increased defense spending at 11%.


Despite improved job approval, Congressman Pappas and Congresswoman Kuster have become somewhat more vulnerable to a strong challenge. 46% of 1st Congressional District voters believe that it is time to give someone new a chance, up from 45%, while 53% of 2nd Congressional District voters believe that it is time to give someone new a chance, up from 50%. Pappas' floor of support is up slightly, with 38% believing he deserves re-election, while Kuster's remains unchanged at 33%. However, new congressional districts have yet to be adopted.


Of the potential Congressional challengers, only 2020 1st Congressional District nominee Matt Mowers has significant name recognition. Mowers leads Republicans seeking to challenge Pappas with 73% name recognition (79% among registered Republicans). However, he carries some residual negatives from his last campaign, resulting in just a +1 favorability at 25%-24% (48%-10% GOP). Trailing Mowers in name recognition are Gail Huff Brown at 49% (53% GOP) with a 13%-13% favorability (25%-7% GOP); Karoline Leavitt at 40% (45% GOP) with an 11%-8% favorability (23%-4% GOP); and Tim Baxter at 36% (42% GOP) with a 7%-6% favorability (14%-3% GOP). In the 2nd Congressional District, Jeff Cozzens has name recognition of 42% (56% GOP) with an 9%-6% favorability (19%-3% GOP); while Robert Burns stands at 38% (56% GOP) with an 8%-8% favorability (16%-5% GOP).


