

Supportive Measures

Supportive Measures are non-disciplinary, non-punitive individualized services offered as appropriate, as reasonably available, and without fee or charge to SAC community members impacted by an incident (such as complainants, respondents, and witnesses) that might fall under the sexual misconduct policies, regardless of whether a formal complaint is filed.

Examples include counseling, extensions of deadlines or other course-related adjustments, modifications of work or class schedules, campus escort services, restrictions on contact between the parties, changes in work or housing locations, leaves of absence.



Contact Title IX

Supportive Measures are individualized services to restore equal access to education, protect safety and deter sexual harassment. Supportive measures are offered *even if the Complainant does not wish to participate in grievance process.*
