# A SURVEY OF LIKELY NH VOTERS September 11-12, 2024

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# **Survey Notes**

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 2241 New Hampshire likely voters. Surveys were collected between September 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>, 2024, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the favorability and ballot tests. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 2.1% with a confidence interval of 95%. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

## **Summary**

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, "Vice President Kamala Harris was the clear winner in her debate with former President Donald Trump. However, the polarized partisan environment leaves her little room to grow, so she sees only a slight improvement in her lead with just under two months to go until Election Day."

**Voters tuned into last Tuesday's debate.** The debate attracted over 65 million viewers, which is over 15 million more than watched the debate between President Joe Biden and Trump. 86% of respondents report having watched the debate.

**New Hampshire voters believe Harris emerged victorious.** 58% of respondents picked her as the winner, while only 22% picked Trump. 18% gave poor marks to both.

Harris has a strong lead among those that watched the debate. She leads by 13 points (54%-41%) among debate watchers. 75% of watchers that claim the debate will impact their decision about whom to support for president report that they will vote for Harris.


Despite the voter attention paid to the debate, the favorability of both candidates remains stable. Harris continues to carry a 51%-48% favorability, identical to the Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll in August. Trump has improved slightly to 43%-57%, up from 42%-48%.


In the wake of her debate success, Harris continues to lead in New Hampshire. She now leads Trump by 8 points, 51%-43%, a slight improvement over her 7-point lead in August.


**Partisan intensity continues to be the key to Harris's ballot strength.** 95% of Democratic voters support Harris, while Trump garners only 87% of Republicans. Harris also leads among undeclared voters, 53%-36%.


Trump has room to gain some ground by focusing on issues. Trump has clear leads among voters that are concerned about the two highest ranked issues: economy/inflation (66%-26%), and border security (94%-3%).
