

# A Survey of Boston, MA, Likely Voters

April 23-25, 2025

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# Survey Notes

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 564 Boston, Massachusetts, likely voters in the upcoming election for Mayor. Surveys were collected between April 23<sup>rd</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>, 2025, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the favorability and ballot tests. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 4.1% with a confidence interval of 95%. The data are weighted for age, gender, race, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

# Summary

**New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, “Heading into the campaign, incumbent Mayor Michelle Wu has begun to consolidate the support she will need for her reelection efforts. Boston has a young, well-educated and diverse electorate that seems satisfied with Wu’s leadership and the overall state of the city. Voter disaffection is directed elsewhere, and as a consequence, Wu begins her campaign in strong shape.”**

**While a strong majority of respondents believe that the country is on the wrong track, a plurality believes that Boston is headed in the right direction.** 72% believe the country is on the wrong track, while only 22% believe it is headed in the right direction. Voters are much more optimistic about the future of the city, with 46% believing it is headed in the right direction against 39% that believe it is on the wrong track. This suggests that to the extent that voters are unhappy, they are unhappy with national leadership rather than local leadership.

**Mayor Michelle Wu gets high marks for her leadership of Boston.** 61% approve of the job she is doing as mayor, while only 37% disapprove. Half believe she deserves reelection, while 32% believe it is time for someone new.

**Wu is personally more popular than her strongest challenger.** Wu boasts a 58%-37% favorable image, while nonprofit executive Josh Kraft is presently underwater at 28%-36%.

**Voters do have some local concerns that could create vulnerabilities for Wu.** 67% disapprove of how the City of Boston manages the cost of housing, while 66% disapprove of how traffic, including bicycles and buses, is managed. 57% disapprove of how homelessness is managed.

**Despite concerns, respondents are satisfied with Boston’s overall quality of life.** 70% are satisfied with the quality of life, with 27% reporting that they are very satisfied. Only 29% of respondents are unsatisfied. Perhaps more than any other factor, this voter contentment with living in Boston may be any challenger’s biggest obstacle to beating Wu.

**Wu’s advantages translate into a strong early lead on the ballot.** If the election were held today, 53% of respondents would vote for Wu while 21% would vote for Kraft.

**On local issues tested, Kraft currently sees advantage only with voters that disapprove of the city’s status as a “sanctuary city”.** He leads among such voters 44%-14%. Wu leads among voters that are discontent with the city’s management of housing costs, traffic, homelessness, crime and public transportation.

**Kraft has a strong lead among voters that are unsatisfied with the city’s overall quality of life.** Kraft wins such voters over Wu, 47%-19%.

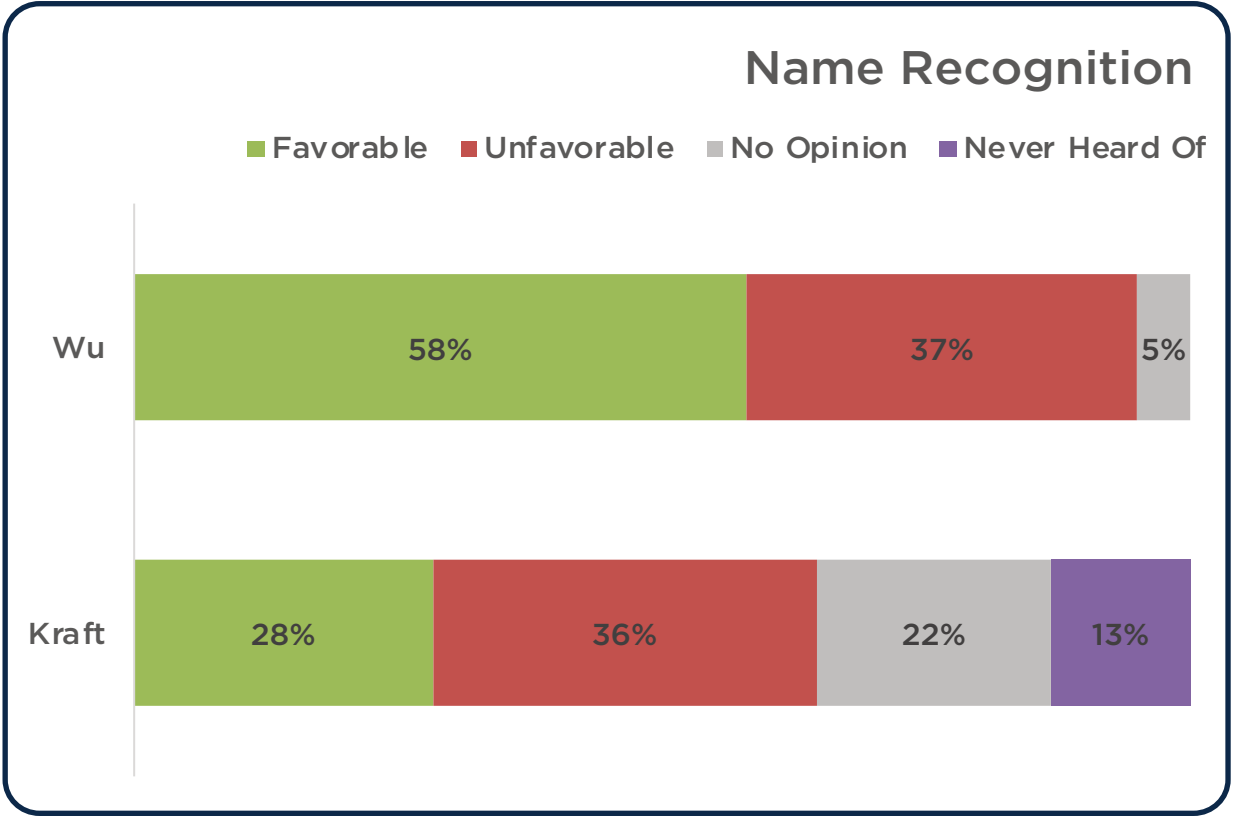
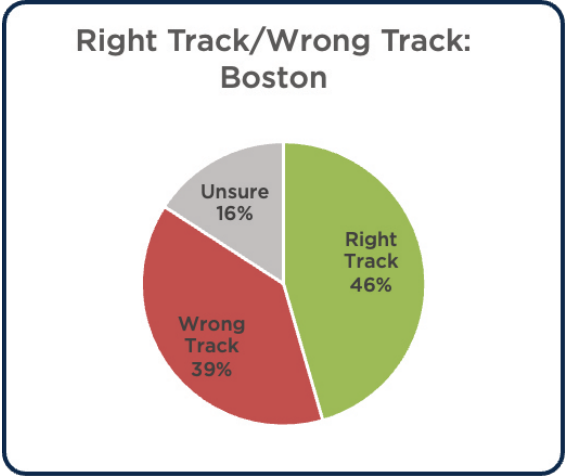
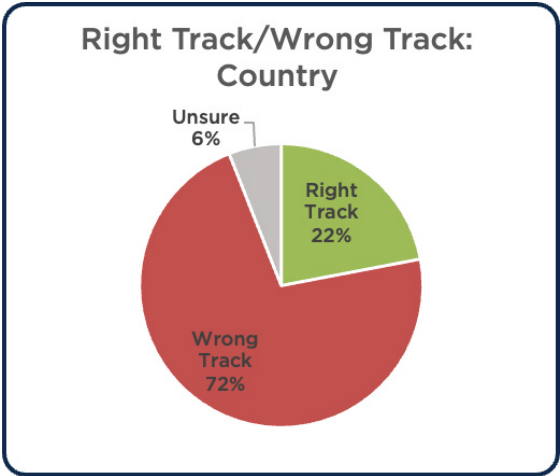
**Wu has an advantage on voters' top three issues.** She wins elections/democracy voters 80%-3%, economy/inflation voters 47%-37%, and affordable housing voters 49%-14%. Kraft wins government spending/taxes voters 46%-16%.

**Wu wins Democrats, Kraft wins Republicans.** Wu leads among Democratic-identifying voters, 75%-8%, while Kraft leads among Republican-identifying voters, 48%-2%.

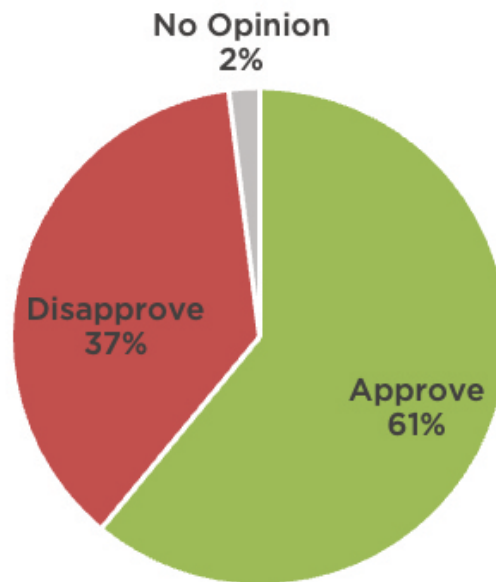
**Kraft has a well-defined base of support, but must build upon it to be successful.** He must convince voters that the city's known weaknesses with affordable housing and traffic management have a large impact on quality of life. His challenge will be to do this against an issues environment that is presently focused on Washington rather than Boston.



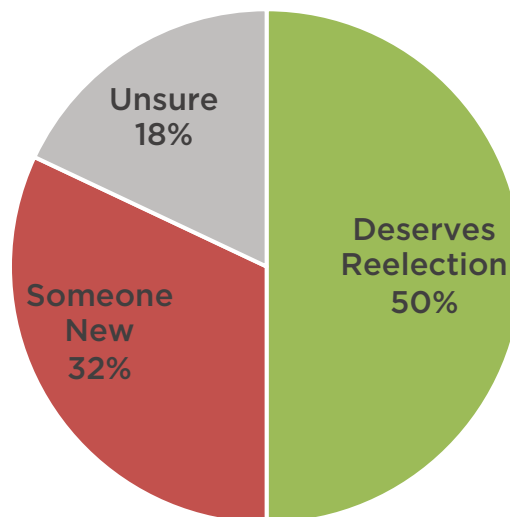

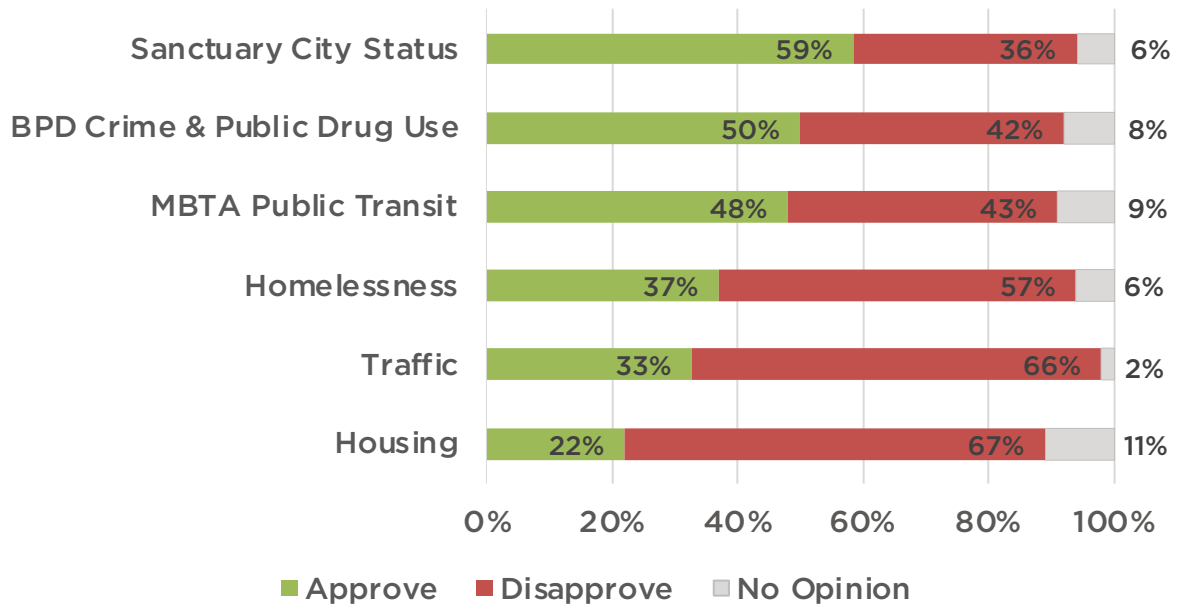
## Wu Job Approval



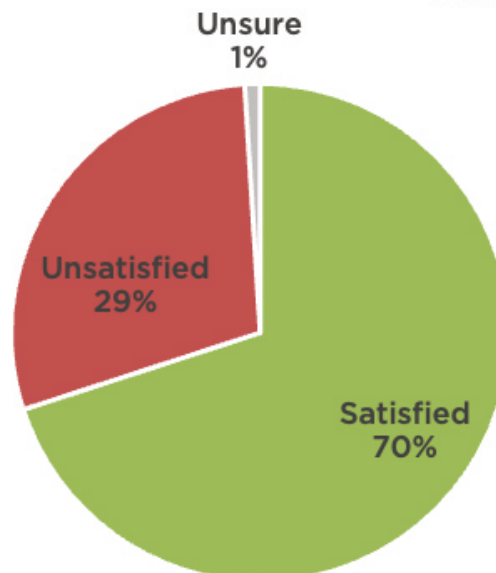
## Does Wu Deserve Reelection?



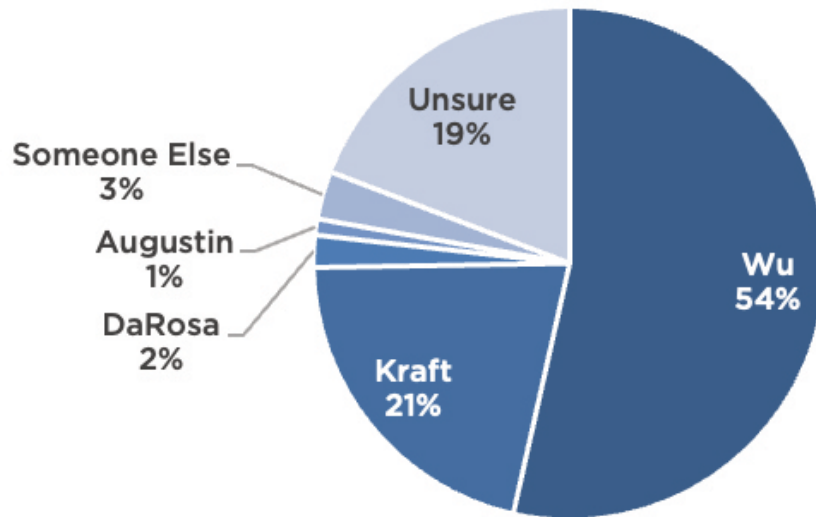
