Survey Notes

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 2112 New Hampshire registered voters. Surveys were collected between November 18th and 19th, 2025, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the favorability and ballot tests. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 2.1% with a confidence interval of 95%. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, education, and 2024 presidential vote based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.



Summary

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, “As we head into the midterm elections, Republicans are on the back foot as Democratic voters show early enthusiasm. Although current officeholders Chris Pappas and Maggie Goodlander have seen their popularity decline over the last couple of months, they’ll look to build on early leads driven by a polarized environment that favors the party out of power.”


- **Voter optimism continues to decline.** 58% of respondents believe the country is on the wrong track, while a plurality (46%) believes New Hampshire is on the wrong track. Voters are very polarized on these questions, with 96% of registered Democrats pessimistic about the country while 78% of Republicans remain optimistic.
- **Elections/Democracy remains the top voter concern.** Although down from 31% in August, 23% of respondents (36% of Democratic voters) still select this as the most important issue facing America.
- **President Donald Trump’s unpopularity is consistent with its historical level.** As in August, 57% of respondents have an unfavorable opinion of the President, while 43% have a favorable opinion. This is identical to his job approval.
- **In an early warning sign for Republicans, Trump polarizes Democrats more than he polarizes his own party.** 97% of Democratic voters disapprove of the job Trump is doing, while only 87% of Republicans approve. 15% of Republican voters believe that Trump is more focused on the concerns of others rather than their own.
- **Voters trust Republicans on the economy, Democrats on affordability.** The Republican Party is more trusted on economic issues, 44%-37%, while the Democratic Party is more trusted on affordability issues, 43%-40%.
- **The Democratic lead on the generic ballot has narrowed as more voters are unsure about which party they will support.** Democrats’ lead has fallen to 4 points, 46%-42%, from 6 in August. In a sign that the lengthy government shutdown may have hurt both parties, 10% are now unsure about for which party’s candidate they will likely vote.
- **Democratic voters are more enthusiastic about voting in next year’s elections.** 93% are “extremely likely” to vote, compared to 86% of Republicans.

- **Governor Kelly Ayotte continues to be relatively well-liked.** 49% have a favorable opinion of her against 44% unfavorable. This represents a net 2-point improvement from August.
- **Former Senator John E. Sununu enters the Republican primary for U.S. Senate as the early favorite.** Sununu begins with a 9-point lead (39%-30%) over another former Senator, Scott Brown.
- **Despite weak popularity, Congressman Chris Pappas is a favorite against either Republican in the race for U.S. Senate.** Pappas' image has narrowed significantly from a net 10-point favorable in August to just 4 points (44%-40%). However, he leads both Republicans in head-to-head matchups: 44%-41% versus Sununu and 44%-36% versus Brown.
- **Freshman Congresswoman Maggie Goodlander's popularity has slipped, but she still enjoys an early lead in a potential repeat matchup against Lily Tang Williams.** Goodlander's net favorability has narrowed from +11 in August to just +1 (40%-39%). Her ballot lead over Williams has narrowed from 18 points to just 5 (40%-35%)
- **Former Portsmouth City Councilor Stefany Shaheen continues to lead in the Democratic Primary for Congress in the 1st District.** 26% of 1st District Democratic voters indicate a preference for Shaheen, well ahead of repeat candidate Maura Sullivan (6%). A changed field in the Republican Party still lacks any significant definition.
- **Republicans approve while Democrats disapprove of Senators Shaheen and Hassan's leadership on ending the federal government shutdown.** 63% of Democratic voters report disapproval of how the Senators handled the shutdown, while a 49% plurality of Republicans approves.
- **Trump's proposal to divert Obamacare subsidies to individuals' Health Savings Account fails to sway voters.** Respondents disapprove of the idea 46%-43%.
- **Vice-President JD Vance continues to be the early Presidential choice of Republicans.** 57% would support the Vice President if the New Hampshire Primary were held today.
- **Former Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg and California Governor Gavin Newsom continue to lead the field in the Democratic Presidential Primary.** Buttigieg (28%) has opened up a small lead over Newsom (24%).




Republican Senate Primary





U.S. Senate Ballot Pappas vs. Brown
