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Survey Notes

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 1614 New Hampshire registered voters. Surveys were collected between June 24th and 25h, 2026, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the favorability and ballot tests. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 2.4% with a confidence interval of 95%. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS:

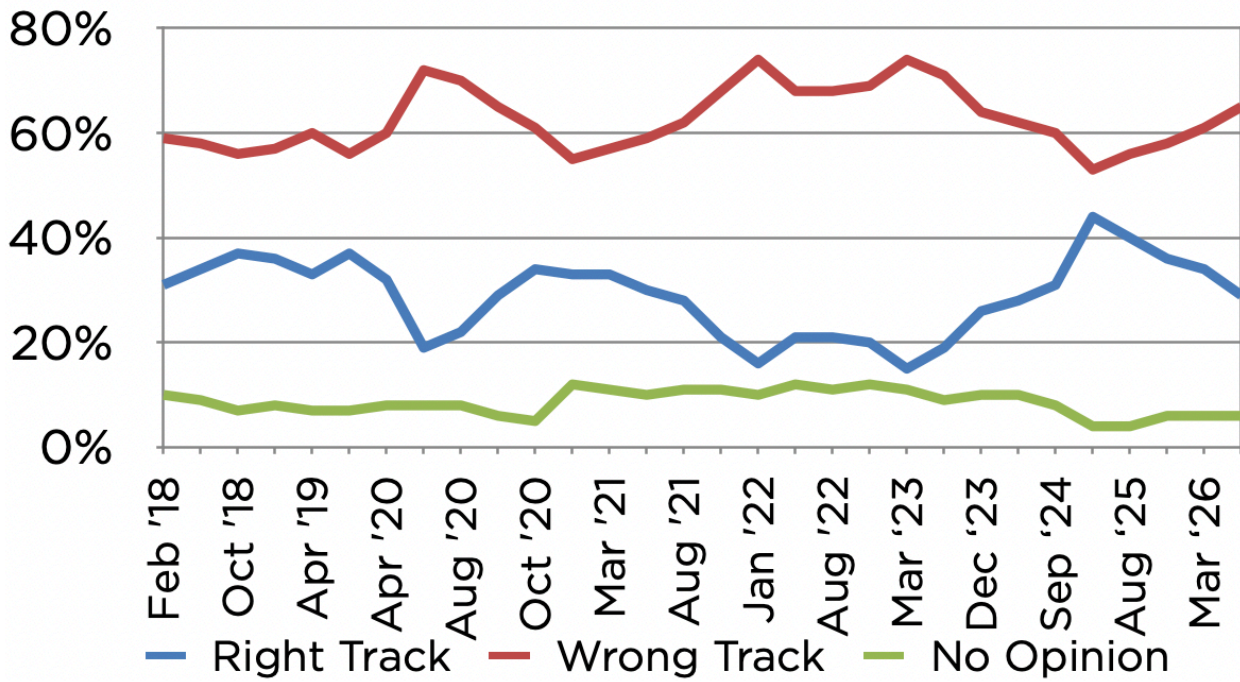
New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, “War, inflation, and economic uncertainty are difficult challenges for any incumbent president, and President Trump has seen significant declines in both his job approval and popularity. The resulting political headwinds are creating opportunities for Democratic candidates as we approach the fall elections. Governor Kelly Ayotte is a bright spot for Republicans as she continues to demonstrate buoyancy, running well ahead of the generic ballot.”

- **Voter pessimism is growing.** 65% now believe the country is on the wrong track, up from 61% in our last survey in March.
- **Support for U.S. military action in Iran is eroding.** Only 35% of respondents approve of the war in Iran, down from 40% in March.
- **President Donald Trump has sustained significant deterioration in both his job approval and his favorability.** Only 38% approve of the job Trump is doing, while 37% have a favorable opinion of the president. This represents a 4-point and 5-point slide respectively, which is remarkable given Trump’s historical stability on both metrics.
- **Although voters trust the two parties equally on economic issues, the Democratic lead on affordability continues to grow.** Voters trust the Democratic Party more on affordability issues by 8 points, up from 7 points in March.
- **Democrats continue to build their lead on the generic ballot.** Democrats now lead by 10 points, 49%-39%, up from 8 points in March.
- **Democratic voters are more enthusiastic about voting in the upcoming elections than Republicans.** 95% of Democrats are extremely likely to vote in November versus 90% of Republicans. Very liberal voters lead all ideological cohorts with 96% extremely likely to vote.
- **Familiar names lead the primary elections.** Congressman Pappas is relatively popular with a 46%-43% favorability, translating into a commanding 62%-20% lead in the Democratic primary for US Senate over newcomer Karishma Manzur (15%-14% favorability). On the Republican side, former US Senator John E. Sununu leads former US Senator Scott Brown by 38 points, 59%-21%. Former Portsmouth City Councilor Stefany Shaheen leads a crowded field in the 1st Congressional District Democratic Congressional primary with 22%, followed by Democratic Party Vice Chair Maura Sullivan with 15%. Repeat candidate Hollie Noveletsky leads the Republican 1st Congressional District contest with 16%, followed by businessman Anthony DiLorenzo with 13%. Incumbent Congresswoman Maggie Goodlander enjoys a substantial lead over challenger Paige Beauchemin, 76%-9%, in the 2nd

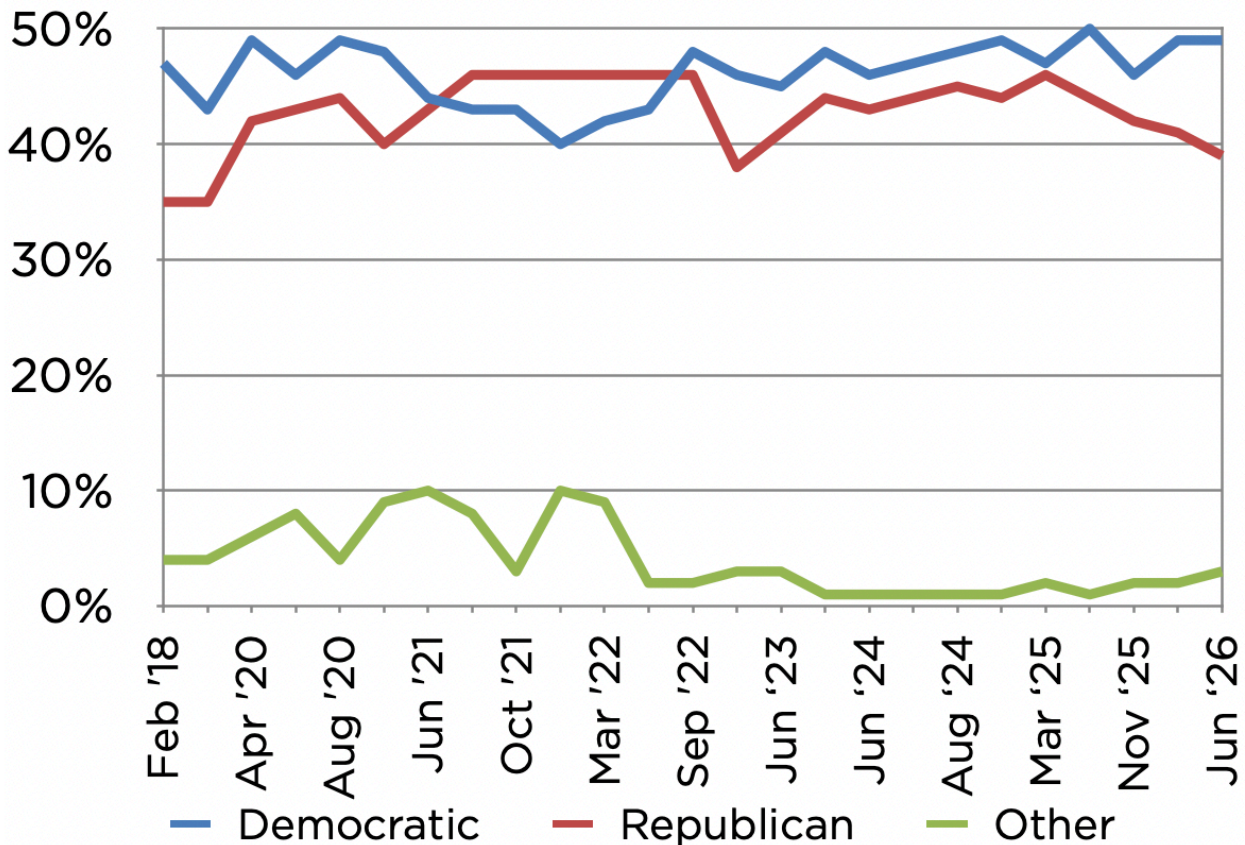
Congressional District Democratic primary. Three-time candidate Lily Tang Williams leads newcomer Victor Orlando, 56%-9%, as she seeks a rematch against Goodlander.

- **Congressman Chris Pappas trails his party's generic ballot, but still leads both Republican candidates for the US Senate.** In his general election matchups, voters pick Pappas over both Sununu (47%-41%) and Brown (48%-36%)
- **Congresswoman Maggie Goodlander enjoys a strong lead in a matchup against Lily Tang Williams.** Goodlander leads repeat foe Williams by 19 points, 50%-31%.
- **Despite the poor political environment for Republicans, a plurality of voters approve of the job Governor Kelly Ayotte is doing.** 49% of respondents approve, while 46% disapprove. 48% have a favorable impression of her against 47% unfavorable. Her general election challenger, former Executive Councilor Cinde Warmington, is underwater with a favorability of 23%-27%.
- **Ayotte remains a favorite for re-election.** In her general election matchup with Warmington, Ayotte leads by 8 points, 45%-37%.
- **Congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez has vaulted ahead of California Governor Gavin Newsom in Democratic voter preference in the New Hampshire Presidential Primary.** At 17%, she now leads Newsom (11%) but continues to trail 2020 second-place finisher Pete Buttigieg (29%).
- **Vice President J.D. Vance remains the early Presidential choice of New Hampshire Republicans, but his lead over Secretary of State Marco Rubio continues to shrink.** Vance is the pick of 37% of Republican voters, but his lead has fallen from 19 points in March to just 7 as Rubio now sits at 30%.
- **As the United States approaches the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, there is a deep partisan split on pride in America.** Almost all (94%) of Republican voters report being proud to be an American citizen, while two-thirds (66%) of Democratic voters are ashamed. A similar number of Republicans (93%) are proud to live in New Hampshire, while a slim majority of Democrats (51%) are proud.

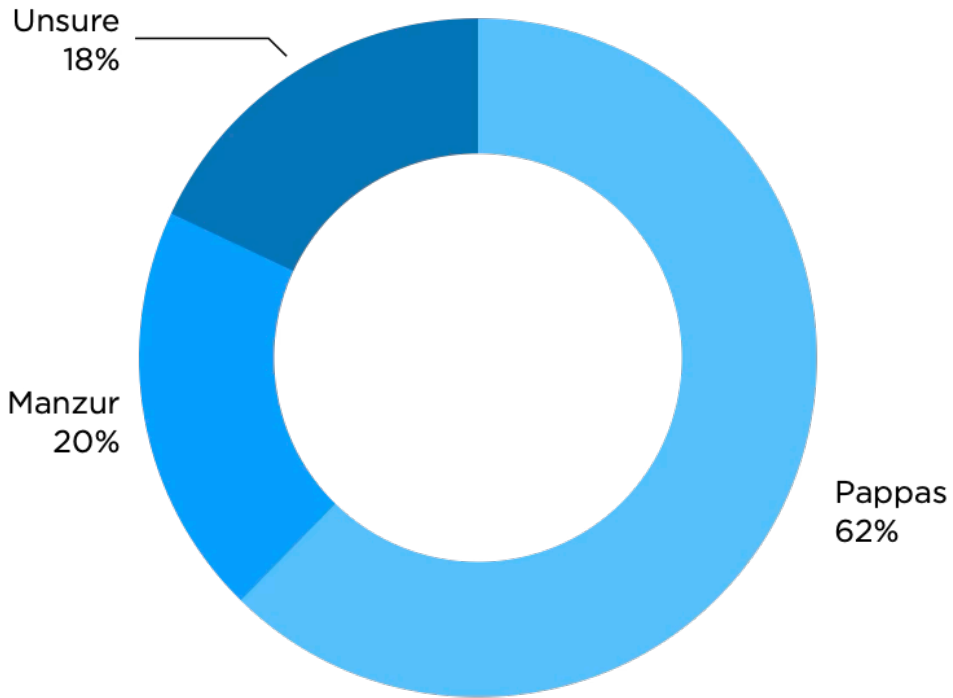
Right Track vs. Wrong Track



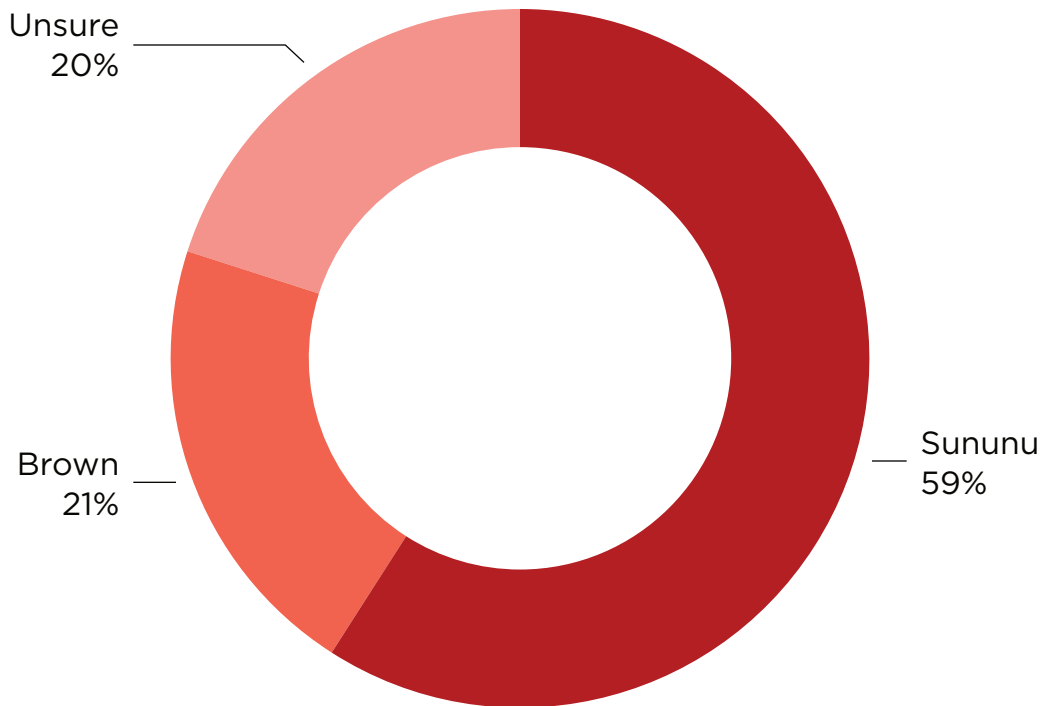
Generic Congressional Ballot



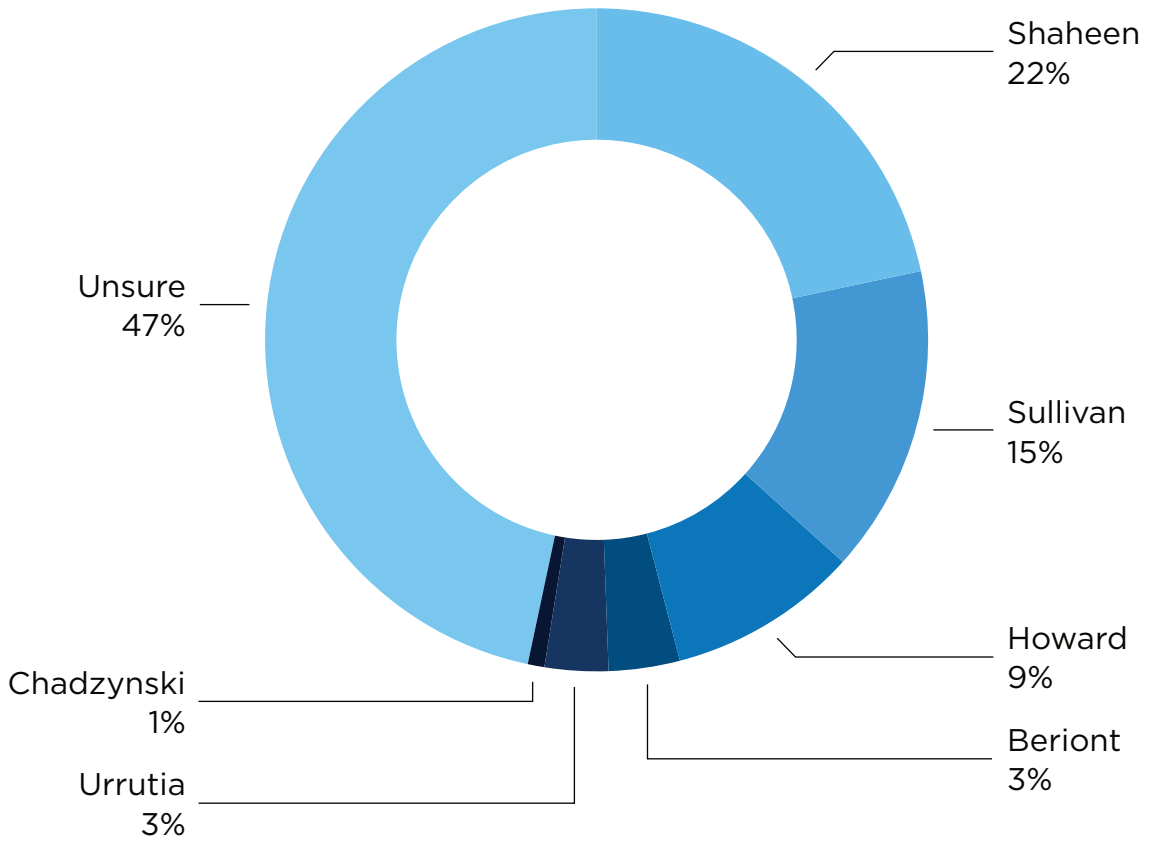
Democratic Senate Primary



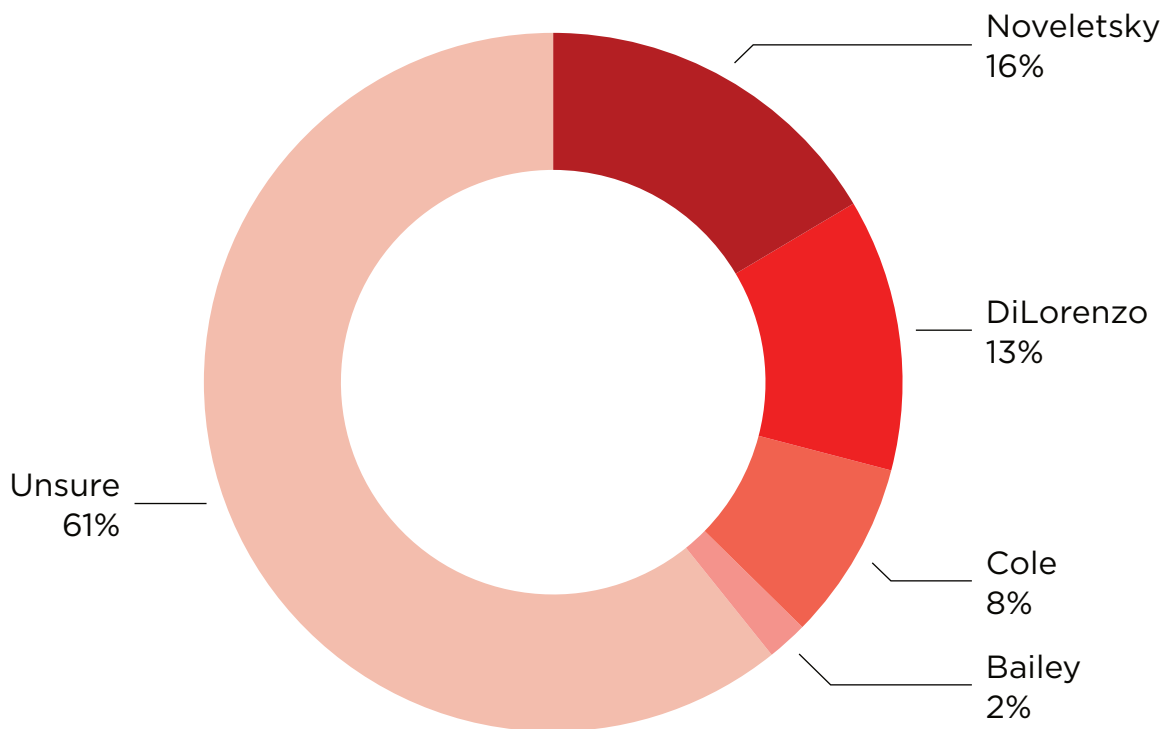
Republican Senate Primary



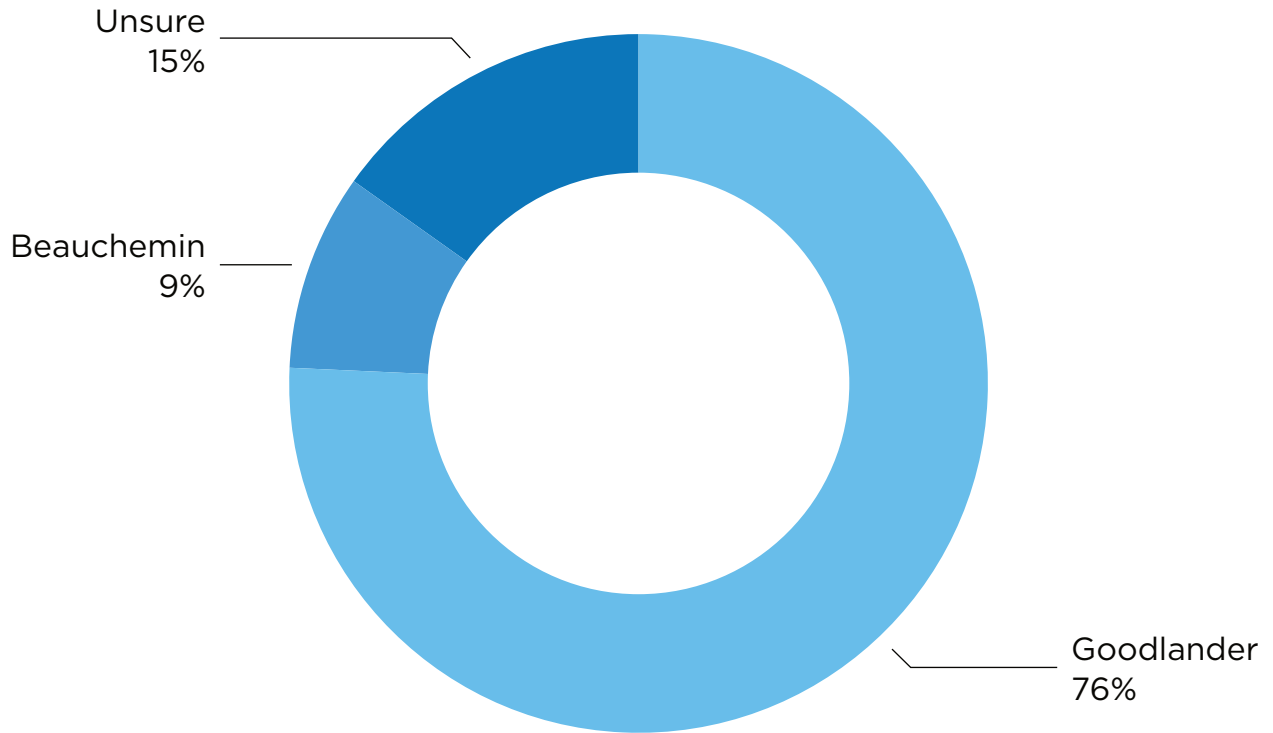
Democratic Congressional Primary (CD-1)



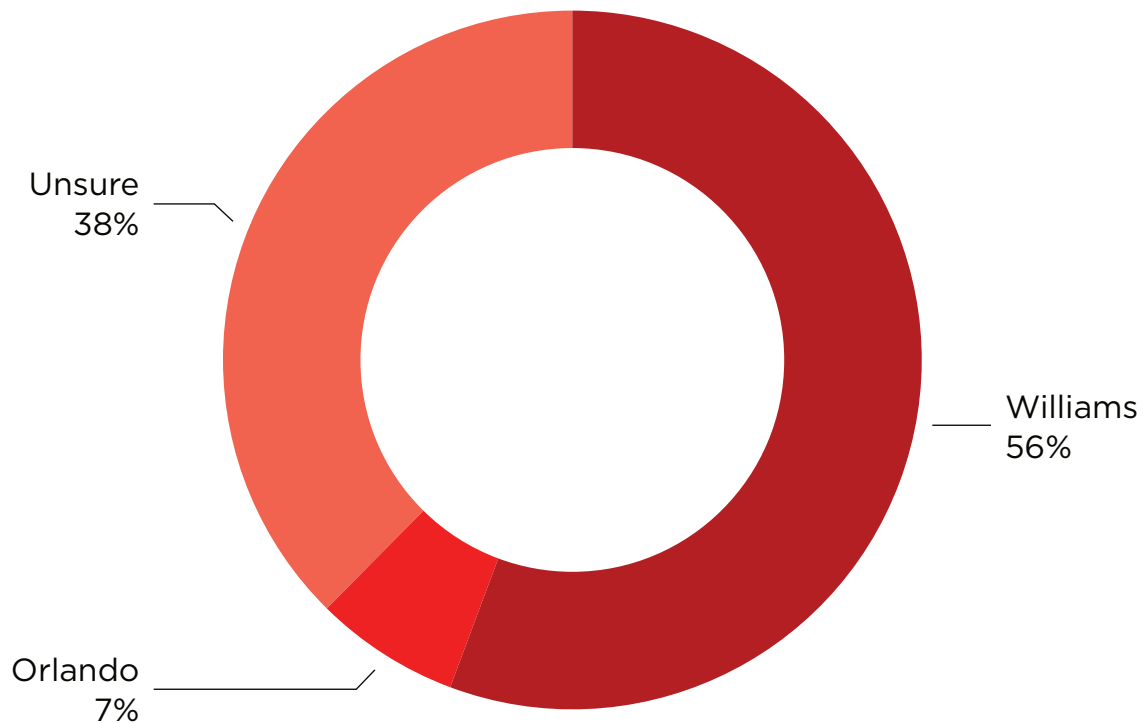
Republican Congressional Primary (CD-1)



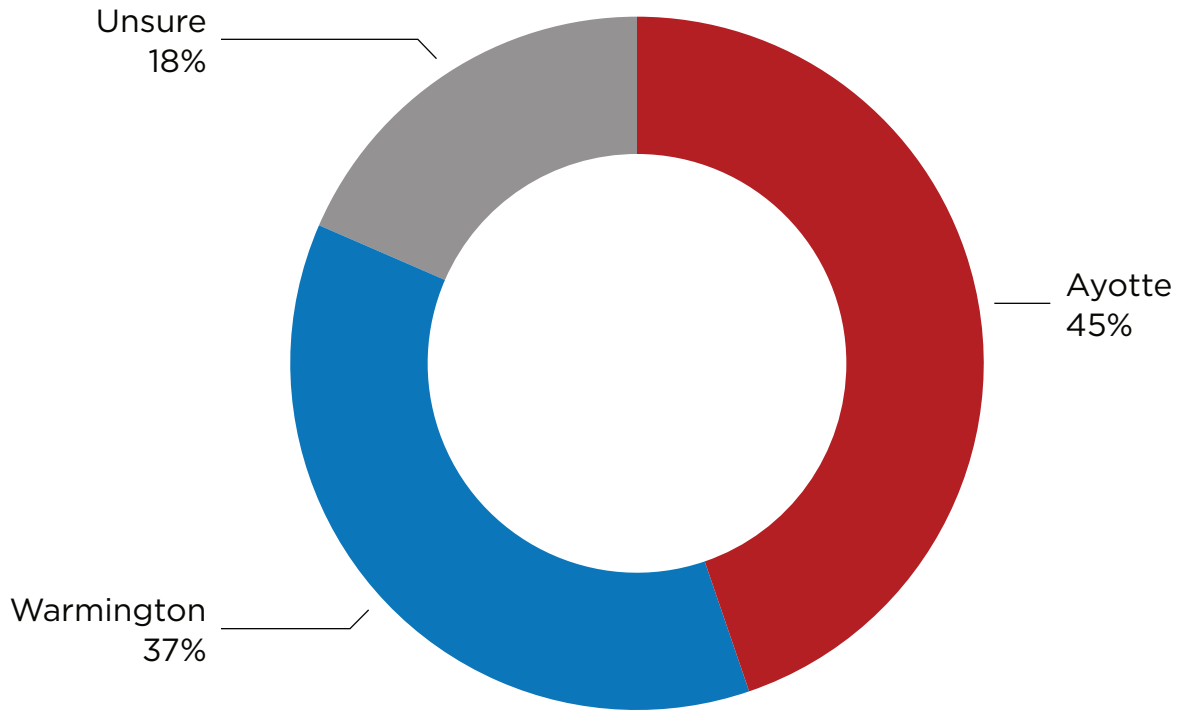
Democratic Congressional Primary (CD-2)



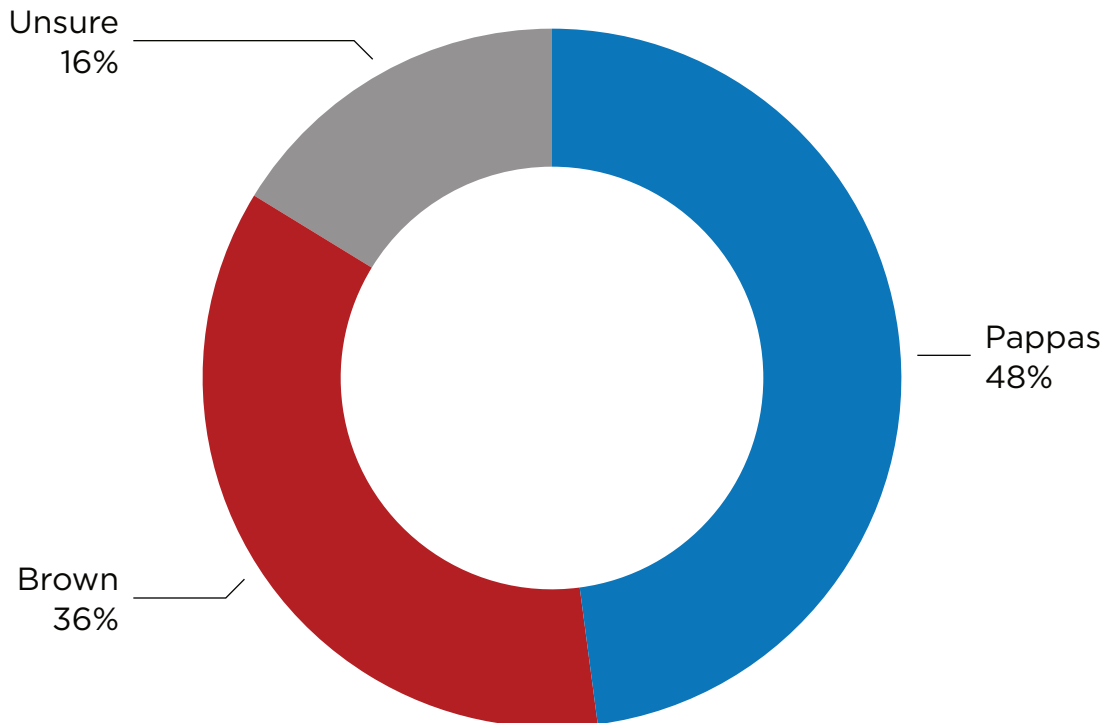
Republican Congressional Primary (CD-2)



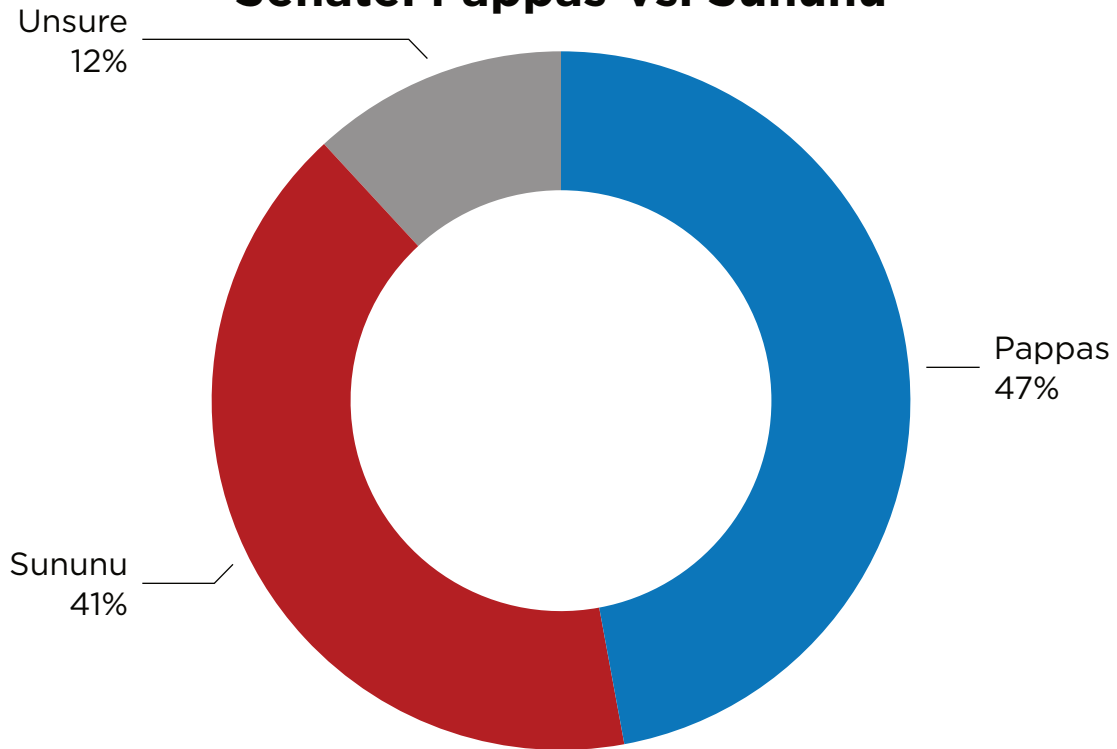
Governor: Ayotte Vs. Warmington



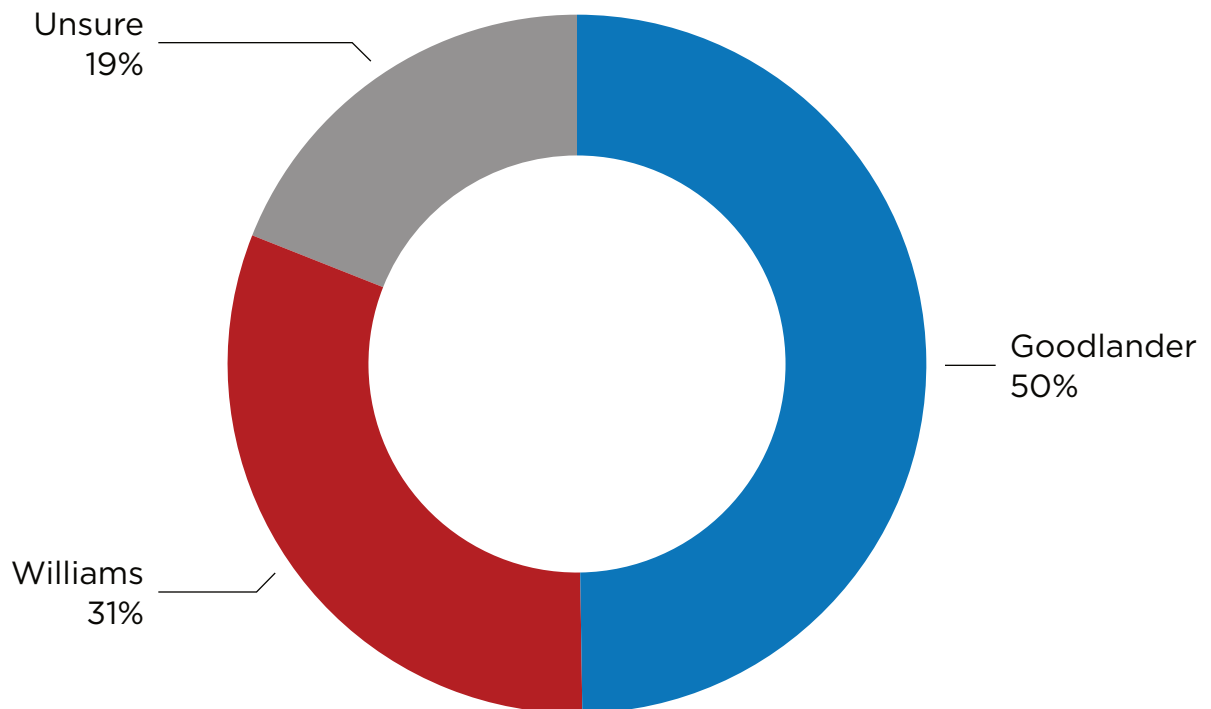
Senate: Pappas Vs. Brown



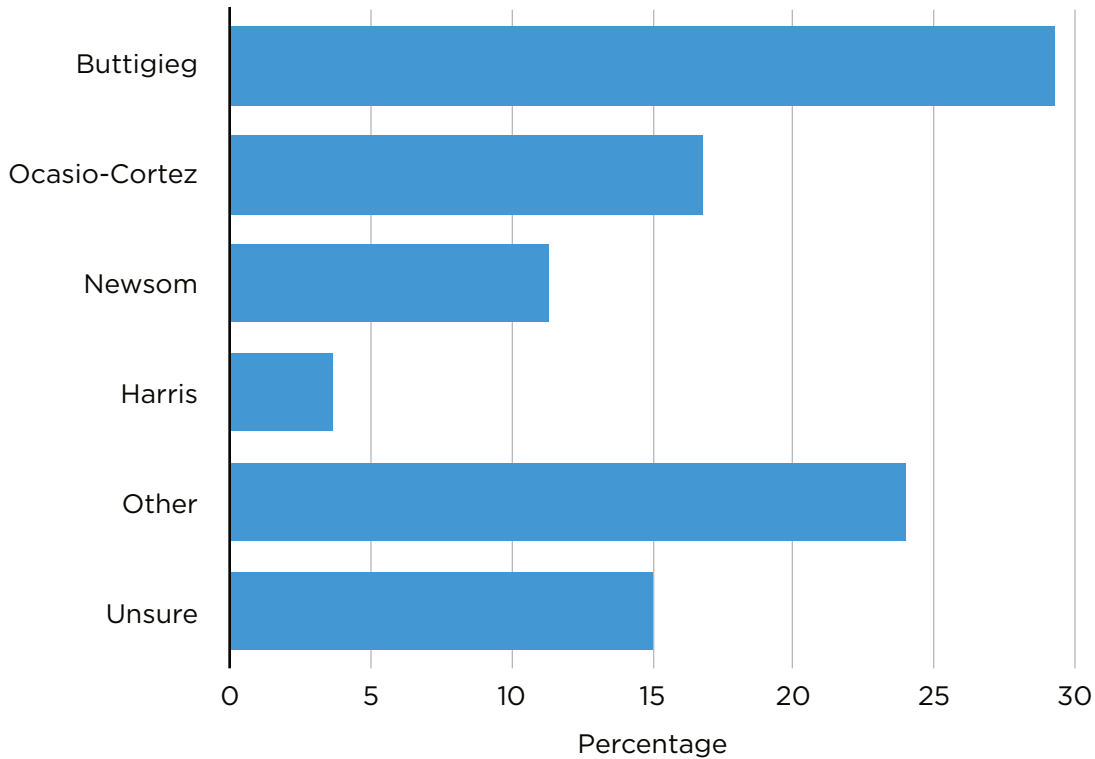

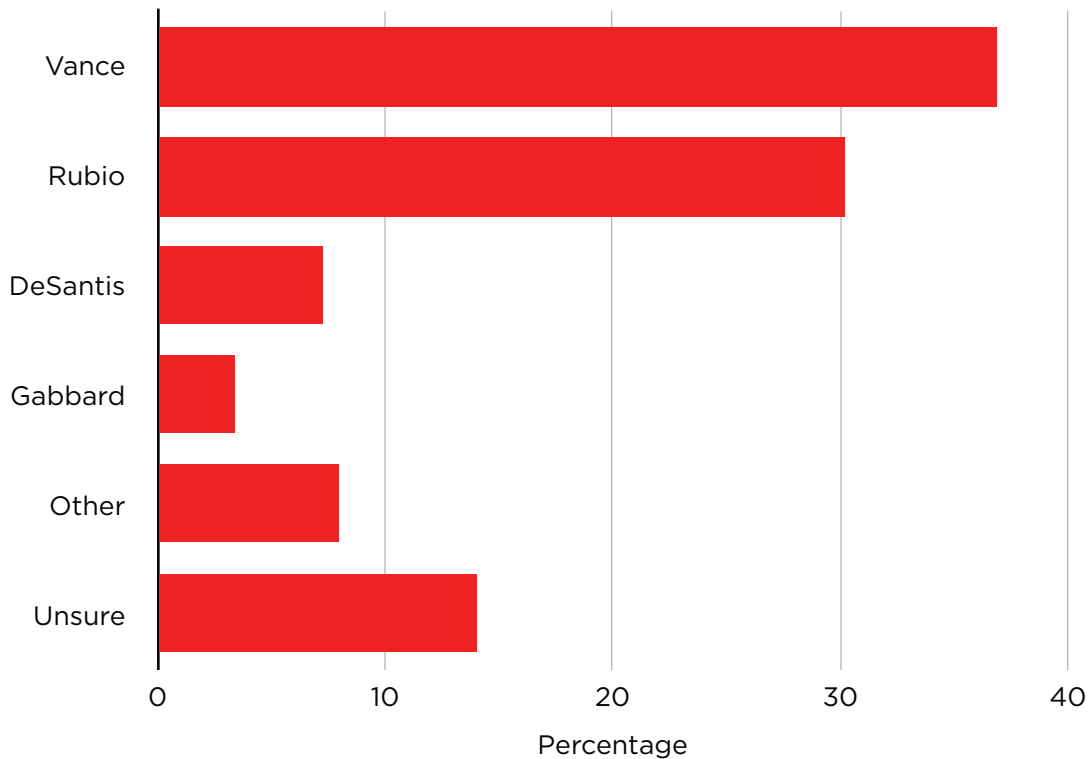
Congressional General Ballot (CD-2)
