Doing your job as a student = employable (real world) skills

This session engages students in a discussion about the habits of successful students and job related skills. Being a competitive and conscientious student translates into success in the workplace. How? Arriving on time for class (it means you are punctual) and submitting papers when they due (you have the ability to meet deadlines). Sending professional emails (this is written communication). Participating in class (oral communication). Resolving a conflict with a classmate (discretion and diplomacy). Meeting with your faculty members and asking for help (networking). Requesting a course authorization (being a self-starter). Managing the workload of 4 courses (project management and the ability to prioritize). These are all marketable skills. Learn how to identify, develop, and market these skills for an internship or a job. Students will be encouraged to ask questions and share their own academic, personal, and job related experiences.

Leading the Way: Involvement and Leadership

This student panel will share with you their sophomore experiences of involvement and engagement and how their involvement led to other opportunities and student leadership.

Exploring Possible Pathways: Got skills, interests, and values? Learn how all three can help you identify your career pathway! "What is your major?" and "What are you going to do with that?" can be difficult questions if you do not know the answers! This session will help you begin to identify your individualized career pathway by providing information on major selection and possible career fields. Learn how to navigate your skills, interests, and values through conversations and interactive activities!
