

he Chapel Art Center is pleased to organize this exhibition of works by New England artist Charles Curtis Allen, N.A., 1886-1950. A member of the group of painters who immediately followed the famous "Boston School," Allen trained at the Worcester Museum School under Hermann Dudley Murphy and Philip Leslie Hale, two artists who were instrumental in handing on an American Impressionist aesthetic first shaped by leaders such as Julian Alden Weir, Frank Weston Benson, and Edmund Tarbell.

In the period of the Great Depression and just before World War II—a time when the progress of American life was seemingly at a standstill—Allen placed himself squarely within a New England landscape tradition as well as the national Regionalist movement. His works reveal the gentle tenderness and devotion of a painter committed to an artistic tradition, but with a fervent artistic spirit that tells the story of a changing modern era.

Hills in Echo is a title that evokes the spirit of this exhibition, which seeks to understand the importance of Allen's evolving and maturing style within the American art scene during the first half of the 20th century. This seems especially fitting as our nation marks the tenth anniversary of September 11th, 2001.


