- Seniors (bachelor's degree must be obtained before the start of the grant);
- Recent SAC alumnae/i (may apply directly; assistance from SAC's FPA is recommended and encouraged);
- U.S. citizenship (no age restrictions);
- Four years of professional study/experience is required for those applying in the creative/performing arts; and
- Researchers must possess sufficient proficiency in the written and spoken language of the
 host country to carry out the proposed study, especially for projects in the social

RECOMMENDATIONS & TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL APPLICATION:

- Meet with the FPA, Prof. Bede Bidlack, in the spring of 2014 before applying and thoroughly review all application instructions provided online at http://us.fulbrightonline.org/application-checklists/academic-applicationchecklist
- Attend a Fulbright information session in the spring of 2014 and begin your application EARLY, submitting your drafts/materials to the FPA in accordance with the established timeline, see below.

- Review IIE's list of tips for your application process: http://us.fulbrightonline.org/application-tips/academic
- Review recommender form. Based on the questions, select recommenders who know you well and who can detail your background in connection with your proposed project. These individuals should be able to assess your academic ability and judge your adaptability and personality. Be sure to request recommendations well in advance to allow your recommenders time to thoughtfully complete the form; and
- Work closely with faculty mentors who can provide you with advice and application
