Graduation rates are calculated according to the number of students in an entering fall cohort who graduate within six years of entering. Students who transfer into the institution are not included in these counts. **Because of the small numbers of students in some of the race/ethnicity categories, three years' worth of data have been combined in order to smooth out some of the year-to-year variations and minimize potential identification.**
