## FINANCIAL AID, 2017-2018

Financial aid includes scholarships (merit scholarships up to \$24,000), grants, loans, and Federal Work Study

- 98% of students were awarded any type of aid
- 97% of students were awarded institutional aid
- \$68.7 million in total aid awarded
- \$42.6 million in institutional scholarships
- \$3 million from funded scholarships
- 84% of the Class of 2017 graduates had loans

## CAMPUS MINISTRY VOLUNTEERISM

- 25,332 hours served on Service & Solidarity Missions and Road for Hope
- 247 student participated in Service & Solidarity: Alternative Break Programs, serving 13 communities through a number of activities, including working in schools for children with autism, welcoming and assisting new refugee families, and building and renovating homes with Habitat for Humanity
- 46 students participated in Road for Hope, benefitting 9 organizations

## NEW HAMPSHIRE INSTITUTE OF POLITICS & POLITICAL LIBRARY

*The New Hampshire Institute of Politics & Political Library brings unique civic, leadership, and political opportunities to Saint Anselm College. In the liberal arts tradition of the college, the Institute presents over 100 public programs and events annually featuring prominent journalists, authors, political and community leaders, and scholars, connecting politics and international affairs with the arts, current events, economics, ethics, history, philosophy, and theology. In FY18, the Institute hosted: former deputy chief of staff to President Obama, Alyssa Mastromonaco; Frank J. Fahrenkopf, Jr., co-chairman of the Commission on Presidential Debates; Mark McKinnon of Showtime's "The Circus;" a panel with White House news reporters moderated by Dan Balz of "The Washington Post;" and several presidential historians.*

## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

*Through the Meelia Center for Community Engagement, students participate in transformative experiential learning, engaged scholarship, and public service work in New Hampshire communities and beyond to address real-world challenges. During the 2017-2018 year, the Meelia Center worked with 60 non-profit agencies as service-learning or volunteer sites.*

- 640 students participated in 42 service-learning sections offered by 9 academic departments
- 46% of the 2018 graduating class participated in at least one service-learning course
- 20,068 service learning & volunteer hours were donated for the 2017-2018 academic year

## CAREER DEVELOPMENT

*The Career Development Center (CDC) engages and supports students as they navigate all aspects of their career development including advising, programs, and resources to help students identify and pursue opportunities they are passionate about.*

- 35% of the 2018 graduating class participated in at least one credit-bearing internship
- In the 2017 - 2018 academic year, approximately 900 internship and full-time opportunities were posted by organizations on the college's online recruiting system, HawkCareers.
- 83% of the 2017 graduates seeking employment had a job within 3 months of graduation, and 99% had a job within 6 months.
