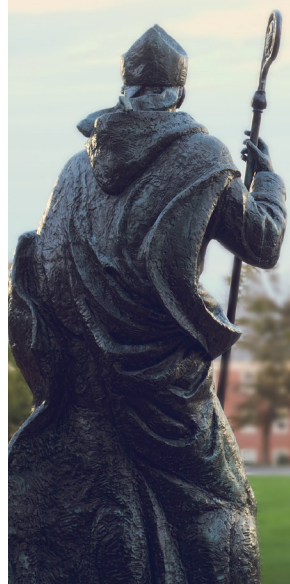


AT A GLANCE

MISSION

Saint Anselm is a Catholic, Benedictine College providing all its students a distinctive liberal arts education that incorporates opportunities for professional and career preparation. It does so in a learning community that encourages the lifelong pursuit of the truth and fosters intellectual, moral and spiritual growth to sustain and enrich its graduates' personal lives, work, and engagement within local, national, and global communities.

FINANCIAL AID, 2020-2021

Financial aid includes scholarships (merit scholarships up to \$25,000), grants, loans, and Federal Work Study

- 99% of students were awarded any type of aid
- 98% of students were awarded institutional aid
- \$76.4 million in total aid awarded
- \$49.7 million in institutional scholarships
- \$2.9 million from funded scholarships
- 80% of the Class of 2020 graduates had loans

CAMPUS MINISTRY VOLUNTEERISM

- Service & Solidarity Missions: 173 students participated in 15 Service & Solidarity Mission trips in 2020, serving 14,532 hours.
- These Missions served 15 different communities in 15 cities doing a variety of service from working in schools and tutoring students, engaging with and assisting refugees, serving meals at soup kitchens, and doing light construction.

ATHLETICS

- 17 NCAA Division II sports
- 502 intercollegiate athletes in fall 2020
- 204 students on NE-10 Commissioner's Honor Roll (Spring 2021)
- Nine sports teams have participated in NCAA Division II championships since the 2019-20 season
- Four NCAA Division II regional championships since 2017-18 (2x softball, women's basketball, men's basketball)
- Two NCAA Division II National Runner-Ups (2018 softball, 2019 field hockey)

ALUMNI

There are 22,186 Saint Anselm College alumni around the world. In fiscal year 2021, about 3,400 alumni made a donation.

FACILITIES & RESOURCES

- 380 acre campus with 57 buildings for academic, residential, and athletic purposes
- 150-bed living learning community built in 2014
- New Student Center Complex completed in spring 2018
- New Welcome Center opened in fall 2020
- Multiple athletic facilities and buildings including a full size turf field with lights, an ice arena, and fitness center
- Over 420 works in the Chapel Art Center's Permanent Collection

RANKINGS

Saint Anselm College remains in the first tier of National Liberal Arts Colleges in the *U.S. News and World Report's Best Colleges 2020*. The guide ranked the college #102, based on such factors as graduation rates, faculty resources, and peer assessments.

NEW HAMPSHIRE INSTITUTE OF POLITICS & POLITICAL LIBRARY

The New Hampshire Institute of Politics & Political Library brings unique civic, leadership, and political opportunities to Saint Anselm College and its students. The Institute presents dozens of public programs and events annually featuring prominent journalists, authors, political and community leaders, and scholars, connecting politics and international affairs with the arts, current events, economics, ethics, history, philosophy, and theology.

The Saint Anselm College Survey Center, housed within the Institute, conducts quarterly polls of New Hampshire voters that are cited by local and national media. This research supports the academic mission of the College and provides the public with insight into political opinion trends that impact the state's federal and gubernatorial elections.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

The mission of the Meelia Center for Community Engagement is to connect the college and the community, and sustain them as partners in addressing real-world challenges.

- 517 students participated in 25 service learning sections offered by 8 academic departments.
- 50 non-profit agencies as service-learning or volunteer sites.
- 44% of the 2021 graduating class participated in at least one service-learning course.
- 8,011 community engaged learning & volunteer hours were donated for the 2020-2021 academic year, despite the challenges of the pandemic. While fewer than usual, the college was still able to engage with the community remotely.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

The Career Development Center (CDC) collaborates with Saint Anselm campus partners, alumni and organizations and assists students with self-assessment, career exploration, experiential opportunities, professional application documents, and preparation for post-graduate planning.

- 30% of the 2020 graduating class participated in at least one credit-bearing internship.
- In the 2020-2021 academic year, approximately 19,620 full-time jobs and 6,668 internships were posted by organizations on the college's online student career management system, Handshake.
- 95% of 2020 graduates are employed, pursuing further education, or volunteering, and 85% of those employed had a job within 6 months.
