# A SURVEY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE VOTER ATTITUDES OCTOBER 23-26 2020

#### **SURVEY NOTES:**

These results are from the Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 1018 New Hampshire voters likely to vote in this fall's elections for President, Governor, and Congress. Surveys were collected between October 23<sup>rd</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>, 2020, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. For questions in which respondents were asked to select from a list of options (e.g. presidential preference), choices were presented in random order. Names were presented in random order for each of the political figure and candidate series (e.g. candidate image). The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 3.1% with a confidence interval of 95%; the margins of sampling error for questions specific to congressional districts are 4.1% for District 1 and 4.6% for District 2. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

The Survey Center continually studies the components that construct a poll, such as interview techniques, voter modeling, and collection methods, in order to refine its methodology and adjust to changes in voter and respondent behavior. This poll departs from the Center's standard use of live telephone interviews and implements an online collection methodology that has been under ongoing study and refinement. Comparison with previous Center polling employing telephone interviews should be evaluated in this context.

#### **OVERVIEW:**

#### Who's Already Voted:

- 27% of respondents overall;
- 44% of older voters (65+);
- 37% of the highly educated;
- 42% of the somewhat liberal and 37% of the very liberal;
- 43% of registered Democrats;
- 40% of self-identified Democrats.

#### Who Has Yet to Vote:

- 73% of respondents overall;
- 74% of those extremely interested in the election;
- 82% of those aged 35-54;
- 77% of those who have a high school diploma or less;
- 87% of the very conservative;
- 81% of registered Republicans;
- 88% of swing voters.

#### **Presidential Preference:**

- Joe Biden leads by 8 points at 52%-44%, down from 12 points (53%-41%) in early October;
- Biden leads 76%-22% on ballots already cast.
- Donald Trump leads 52%-44% among voters who have yet to vote.
- Biden leads among women (56%-41%) and men (48%-47%).
- Biden has a clear lead among younger (58%-38%) and older (59%-39%) voters, and is tied (48%-48%) with voters aged 35-64.
- Biden's overall edge is provided by greater polarization among Democrats (96%-3%), and winning undeclared voters (52%-40%).
- Trump is losing 11% of Republicans.
- Biden is ahead in both the 1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District (51%-46%) and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District (54%-41%).
- By a 40%-39% margin, New Hampshire voters believe Biden will win the election.

#### **Gubernatorial Preference:**

- Incumbent Governor Chris Sununu has expanded his margin from 58%-35% since early October and now has a comfortable 60%-35% lead.
- Sununu's popularity is across all demographics, but his lead is weakest among younger voters, at 49%-46%.
- Sununu's overall edge is provided by greater polarization among Republicans (95%-4%), and winning undeclared voters (68%-24%).
- Challenger Dan Feltes is losing 14% of Democrats.
- Sununu has strong leads in both congressional districts (62%-32% in CD1, 57%-38% in CD2).

#### Senate Preference:

- Incumbent Senator Jeanne Shaheen has expanded her margin slightly since early October and currently enjoys a 54%-39% lead.
- Shaheen has built a substantial lead in ballots already cast (76%-21%), but challenger Corky Messner leads 46%-45% among votes who have yet to vote;
- Shaheen has nearly unanimous support among Democrats (97%-2%), and is leading among undeclared voters 53%-32%.

#### 1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District Preference:

- Challenger Matt Mowers has cut incumbent Congressman Chris Pappas' early October 8-point lead to 5, and now trails 49%-44%.
- Although Pappas has consolidated Democrats (92%-2%), and has held onto 10% of Republican voters, this race is competitive due to Mowers' lead of 45%-44% among undeclared voters.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District Preference:

- Incumbent Congresswoman Annie Kuster has maintained her early October lead and now enjoys a 54%-40% margin over repeat challenger Steve Negron.
- The outlook for this race is substantially different than in the 1<sup>st</sup> CD due to Kuster's 59%-32% lead among undeclared voters.
