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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, "In our first poll of the 2022 political cycle, we find voters very much where they were on Election Day, with support for the new President reflecting his vote share. Having won New Hampshire 53%-45%, Joe Biden starts his administration with an identical job approval, and an almost identical (53%-46%) favorability among registered voters. This 53%-45% spread is also found on the question of convicting former President Donald Trump in the Senate. This was a hotly contested and highly polarizing race, and these results show that at the dawn of the Biden era, voters aren't moving an inch as of yet.

"Governor Chris Sununu begins his third term with a 72%-27% job approval rating. This in part reflects voters' evaluation of the State's COVID response, with 67% grading the response 'excellent' or 'good', against 33% grading it 'fair' or 'poor'. Sununu's strong support carried him to a landslide victory, and he remains popular. "Despite voter support for Biden carrying through from the election, support for the Congressional delegation has waned somewhat, with Senator Jeanne Shaheen's job approval softening by a couple points since our last poll to 54%-38%, Senator Maggie Hassan's following suit to 49%-40%, Congressman Chris Pappas' dropping 5 points to 43%-38%, and Congresswoman Annie Kuster's also dropping 5 points to 46%-40%.

Also, in the Center's first ever look at Hassan's electability, while 39% of voters believe she deserves re-election, 47% think that it's time to give someone new a chance. This "soft re-election" question understates an incumbent's strength somewhat, and 39% should be seen as Hassan's absolute floor of re-election support. "This suggests an emerging dynamic familiar from other recent periods of united government: a challenging midterm election environment for incumbents of the majority party. None of the delegation members are necessarily in re-election trouble -- Congresswoman Kuster in particular has shown a strong ability to outrun her poll numbers – but they will be vulnerable if the general voting environment turns against their party and they face strong opponents. New Hampshire could have two or even three closely-watched races this cycle with national implications.


"Voters are confident in the integrity of New Hampshire's last election, with 83% expressing confidence in the results. A clear majority (61%) likewise reported confidence in the national results."As social media platforms struggle to define their role in providing voters with information, this poll suggests they face a deep voter divide, with 45% believing such platforms have an obligation to allow all speech and 47% believing they have an obligation to remove content deemed harmful. The tension between these platforms' roles as a public square and as a gatekeeper of information will likely continue as an important debate throughout this political cycle."In a sign that the pitch of our current political conflict isn't likely to moderate anytime soon, a remarkable 64% of voters don't trust the news media to be a fair referee in determining what constitutes misinformation. Distrust of the media is virtually universal (98%) among Republicans and is universal among the very conservative. But trust is also weak among Democrats (51%) and liberals (46%), suggesting that the media's credibility problem is beginning to transcend party and ideology. A healthy democracy depends on voters that have access to credible objective information to help manage and resolve political disputes; this poll suggests that we may be on the verge of losing that, if we haven't already."


SURVEY NOTES


These results are from the Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 867 New Hampshire registered voters. Surveys were collected between February 4th and 6th, 2021, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for each of the political leader series (e.g. job approval).


The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of $\pm -3.3\%$ with a confidence interval of 95%; the margin of sampling error for questions specific to congressional districts are 4.7% for each district. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.


The Survey Center continually studies the components that construct a poll, such as interview techniques, voter modeling, and collection methods, in order to refine its methodology and adjust to changes in voter and respondent behavior. This poll departs from the Center's standard use of live telephone interviews and implements an online collection methodology that has been under ongoing study and refinement. Comparison with previous Center polling employing telephone interviews should be evaluated in this context.
