

Donor Impact Report 2016

Your help means we can better serve our students.

Rising academic excellence: 530 first-year and transfer students comprise the Class of 2020. This first-year class represents one of the most diverse and academically talented classes ever to be enrolled at Saint Anselm. Academic quality as measured by high school GPA is at an all-time high.

Expanding facilities for our campus: On Monday, September 12, the Board of Trustees gave final approval for a renovation and expansion of the Student Center, a project which will greatly increase the functionality of the space. The three floors of the building have been laid out with spaces dedicated to the "themes" of academic success, programs at the core of our mission, and student organizations and services. Event space, a bookstore, a late-night café, a game room, dedicated study space, and a 250-seat auditorium are also included in the plans. See preliminary designs on the reverse.

Broadening national attention and recognition for our college: More than 150 million viewers tuned in to watch last winter's twin New Hampshire presidential primary debates on ABC News. Saint Anselm College and the New Hampshire Institute of Politics were mentioned more than 8,000 times in media coverage during this time, resulting in a publicity value of nearly \$40M. High profile visits by both candidates and their running mates in the past year have only solidified Saint Anselm College and the Institute of Politics as "New Hampshire's home for politics." Fall events include a series of 12 televised debates and forums, noted authors, and speakers at the Institute.

Growing donor generosity: Fiscal Year 2016 concluded on June 30 with our donors showing extraordinary generosity and making this the fourth best fundraising year in the history of the college. Many thanks to our benefactors who gave the following:
